1 JOE WELDEN— works with various textures and colors obtained through acrylic paint, enamel, shellac, interior wall paints, crayons and markers. Collage often appears in his work. BETTY BRYDEN works in ink, acrylic and watercolor on handmade papers. She is known for her delicate drawing/paintings of nature's objects and her bold depictions of the local landscape in collage.

4 RODRICA TILLEY— "Vivid, lively and fresh" describes Rodrica's landscape and garden paintings. Vermillion tulips, tangled verdant foliage, deep peaceful creeks, violet-grey storm clouds over gold hills are typical subjects of this nationally published and widely collected artist. She's fast too – watch two complete paintings unfold at the easel on Monday: watercolor at 11 am, pastel at 2pm ... Located three miles east of Montrose, just off PA 706, on McCollum Rd. 5 There are two artists at the **Holy Name of Mary Parish Center**, ("Green House"), S. Main St., Montrose, across from the Holy Name of Mary Catholic Church. At the red light in Montrose take PA 29 South, ¼ mile. House is on the right. 570 278-2141

RITA EDDY—Rita Eddy is featuring pastel paintings of Susquehanna County this year. The beauty of the county is her inspiration. She also works in watercolor and acrylics, making paintings and greeting cards that picture landscapes, gardens, exotic travels and nature. 6 EARL LEHMAN—Returning to Susquehanna County after 10 years in Lackawanna, Earl is building a brand new studio in the woods, just north of Lake Tuscarora. Visitors will encounter a feast of deliciously unexpected abstract imagery, and landscapes pulsing with the life force of their creation, displayed in a kind of glass-enclosed, live-in sculpture set in a hill. From PA 267 in Lawton (at the post office) take PA 367S uphill for 2.9 miles. Studio will be on left, downhill. From Rt. 6 in Laceyville take PA 367N 9.4 miles (curvy but nice). 7 MARC SCHIMSKY—Marc is sensitive to the passage of time and the fleeting and impermanent nature of life. His paintings often reflect experiences he has encountered while traveling or activities involving family and friends. His vibrant color palette and his brushwork are reminiscent of the Expressionists and the San Francisco Bay Area Figurative Painters.

8 CAROL ANGELA BROWN / TEATIME STUDIO— Carol has been admired for her historical renderings of local sites in oil. From a snow-shrouded Christmas Tree in front of the Courthouse, to a 50's Diner in So. Montrose, to the airing of the quilts in Tunkhannock – she catches the spirit of the area. In 2008 she was selected to paint an ornament for the White House Christmas Tree and attended a reception there for its unveiling. She also sells limited -prints of her work as well as hand-painted porcelain.
...Studio is located on Rt. 29 about 2 miles south of the blinking light in South Montrose or about 1/2 mile north of the blinking light in Dimock. teatimeartstudio.com/570-278-9642

9 MEGAN CONNER / TERRA INCOGNITA CLAYWORKS —Megan's work is strongly influenced by the colors and subtle textures found in the natural world. The veins of a leaf or the texture of eroded stone represent growth and the passage of time—ideas that find expression in the carved and stamped surfaces of her pottery and the layered, textural compositions of her tile work. At her studio, you will find a variety of functional and decorative ceramics, from serving bowls, mugs and platters, to sculptural wall tiles, mirror frames, mosaics and more. On Monday she will demonstrate carving a candle lantern. ...Megan's studio is located adjacent to Tall Pines Farm Stoves & Fireplaces on PA 167 between Montrose & Brooklyn. 10 LINDA TRUMAN— captures interactions between man and the natural world in watercolor and pastel. Many of her pieces depict the unique characteristics of birds. She will be demonstrating how to draw / sketch songbirds for reference on Monday.
...From PA 706/167 junction located east of Montrose, take PA 167 South one mile. Turn onto the first left dirt road, bear right at the immediate "T", and follow signs for one mile. 570-278-2332

11 JAN WINEMILLER / TINGLEY GLASS—In her home studio on beautiful Tingley Lake near Harford, Jan Winemiller creates jewelry, tableware, windows and more using both stained glass and kiln-forming techniques, characterized by a playful use of color and highly refined attention to finish. The studio also offers classes for students of all ages and abilities. On Monday, Jan will demonstrate glass cutting and soldering techniques on a stained glass window panel.
...From Montrose, take Route 706 to New Milford. Turn left on Route 11 North. Turn right onto SR 848 toward Harford. Drive 1.3 miles and turn right onto Tingley Lake Road. Drive 3.9 miles, take a sharp left (stay on Tingley Lake Road). Drive 1 mile to Prout Lane on the left. From I-81, take exit #217 Harford. Turn onto SR 547 South. Drive 1 mile to stop sign at Fair Hill Road. Turn left into the village. Bear right at the triangle, and turn right onto Tingley Lake Road. 12 JOE DEORIO—Nationally award winning and exhibiting artist of 45 years plus will be exhibiting over 100 works in pastels, oils, constructions and sculpture. A 10% discount will be given during the Open House Weekend. Refreshments will be served. Monday he will demonstrate a nature scene in pastel. ...Exit #211 off Rt.81 (Lenox). Left at stop and right onto Rt. 92 (blinking light) 8 1/2 miles turn right after American Car repairs (in Gelatt) approx. 1 mile. Right onto Baldwin Rd. (no sign). It is 50 ft. past hardtop road to Fiddle Lake. 1 mile left into drive, 1105 Baldwin Rd. (800ft. driveway) 732-397-0454 **W**

14 MUD AND FIRE POTTERS / ARCHIE JOHNSON & RUTH COHEN — continue to intermix new and conventional forms within their functional and decorative ware. With roots in Asian, Western and Jamaican/African cultures, their wood-fired pieces have a unique freshness and vitality, featuring intriguing textures, shino glazes and earth-tone colors. 15 LESLI & KIRK VANZANDBERGEN—Lesli & Kirk Van Zandbergen use their bucolic country setting as inspiration and often a backdrop for their award-winning photography. Come enjoy the friendship, beautiful scenery, chickens and even llamas!

...From NY 434 south of Binghamton take Pennsylvania Ave South 8.3 miles, turn left on PA 167 for .6 mile, left on Arrowhead Lake Rd. They are .9 mile on the left. 16 CHARLES RANDALL— His work is primarily landscapes, covering the beautiful local scenery in all its permutations throughout the seasons. He works primarily with watercolors, a beautiful though demanding medium. His studio is in an attractive 1820 barn, where he enjoys seeing people on the tour weekend.

...The studio is located on S.R.167 between Montrose and Binghamton, about 8 miles north of Montrose. Look for a white mailbox with #19928. The driveway goes up through a field; the barn is behind the house. 570 663-2923 **W**

17 GEORGE AND BEN MANNs— Whether you appreciate traditional cabinetry or a more sculptural style of woodworking, you will find something to see – and touch - at the shop of George and Ben Manns – father and son woodworkers. 570 553-2729

...From Montrose: 706 W. to Lawton, right onto 267 N. Go two miles, turn left onto Irish Hill Rd., which turns to the right at the top of the hill. Shop is on the right 4 miles from that turn. From Vestal take NY 26 S. to PA 267 S. for 8 miles, turn right on Turnpike St. (SR4014). Go 2 miles and turn left onto Irish Hill Rd. Shop is 2 miles on left. **W**

19 STEVE CONLEY—Stephen Conley's work has been collected by museums, colleges and private collections. His work currently hangs at Harvard University, New York University and Treadwell Corp. in NYC. Steve works in acrylics and builds layer upon layer creating edges that merge and retract to make a composite in the viewer's eye. Many of his paintings work together in a series with topics of cave painting, nature or sexuality. During the last years, Steve has been commissioned to do many unique portraits.

...Going North on Rt.81 follow Rt. 374 past Elk Mt. to Dimock Corners. Take a left onto S.R. 2034 (now called Old Newburg Tpk.); there will be a sign there, 1 ½ miles, from Dimock Corners on the right - #2787 Old Newburg Tpk. Conleyart.com, 570 679-9454 **W**

20 KEN ELY / GOOD NEIGHBOR WALLS— This year Ken will be building a new stone wall bordering the driveway entrance to property that he and his wife own in Dimock Township. It will be a retaining wall composed of fieldstones of varying sizes and shapes, and its purpose will be to add definition to the drive's edges and to create an easily accessed area for plantings such as perennials, ground cover, or ferns, since it is a wooded site.

...To visit Ken's project, follow Route 29 to Dimock (between Montrose and Springville). At Baker's Garage in Dimock, turn east onto 3023. Follow this road (toward Hop Bottom and Nicholson) for 2.2 miles from Route 29. The property is on the left.

Ken enjoys talking with visitors about building technique, geology, and history of stone walls in our region.
